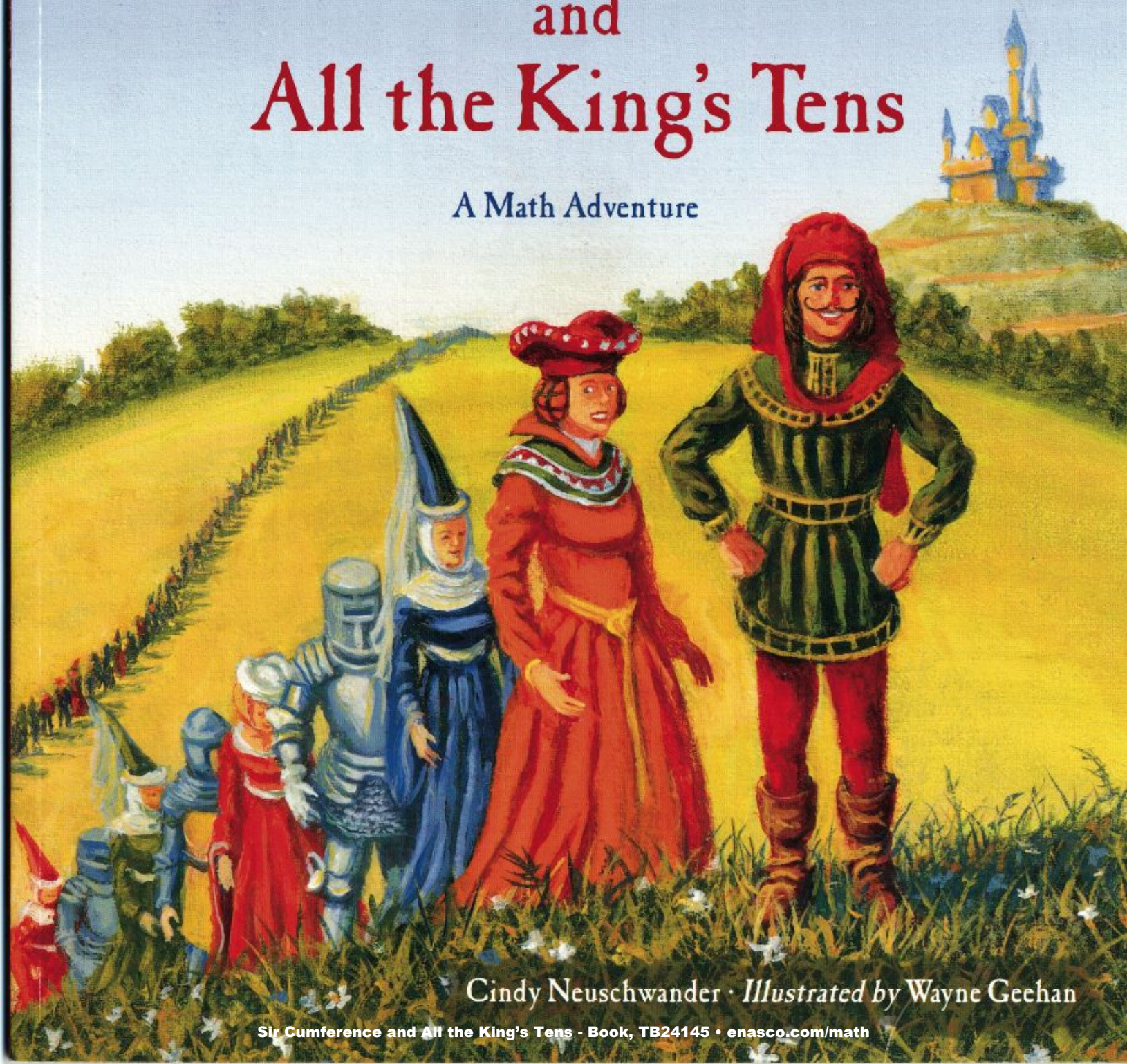


Sir Cumference and All the King's Tens
